Introduction

This plan provides templates for recording the management of trees on land under the Parish Council's control. Filling in these templates will provide evidence of compliance with the Parish Council's Tree Management Policy.

Each area is allocated to one of three zones depending on its use. Inspection levels are set for each zone. Actions are based on the outcome of the inspections.

Templates for recording zoning, inspection and actions are included at the end of this document.

Identifying areas to be assessed.

Identification can be carried out by anyone familiar with the land managed by the Parish Council. Areas identified can be recorded using the template "Areas and zoning". After this has been completed for the first time it can simply be reviewed to record anything that has changed (e.g. acquisition or disposal of land).

Zoning

Zoning can be carried out by anyone familiar with the use of the area identified. Zoning can be carried out using the following guide.

Inspection

Each level of inspection is described as follows.

Informal inspection

Can be carried out by anyone. Councilors, employees, contractors, tenants and the public are simply asked to bring to the Council's attention any tree giving them a cause for concern. There is no programme of planned inspection. Where concerns are highlighted a formal inspection to determine any action to be taken should follow.

Formal inspection

Can be carried out by anyone familiarising themselves with the Forestry Commission publication "Common Sense Risk Management of Trees". or using the questions posed in the template "Formal inspection". Formal inspection will be part of a planned programme based on zoning or in response to an informal inspection observation.

Detailed inspection

Should be carried out by a competent person with expert knowledge. Detailed inspection will be carried out in zones identified as high risk or as an action arising from a formal inspection.

Action

If the observations from a formal inspection suggest a level of risk too high to be accepted an entry should be recorded using the template "Suggested action". Any entries on this table will be reviewed by the Parish Council to agree what action, if any, should be taken.

Records

The clerk will retain any completed forms. The minutes of the Parish Council will record any suggested actions reviewed and actions taken. Actions reviewed may be as a result of formal or detailed (expert) inspections.
